INTROIT: Listen, O Shepherd of Israel, You who lead Joseph like a flock! You, who are enthroned between the cherubim, shine forth before Ephraim, Benjamin and Manasseh! Stir up Your strength and come to save us!

Restore us, O God, and cause Your face to shine, that we may be saved!

O LORD, God of hosts, how long will You smoulder in anger against the prayers of Your people?

You have fed them with the bread of tears and given them a third of a measure of tears to drink.

You cause us to have strife with our neighbours, and our enemies are laughing among themselves.

O God of hosts, restore us and cause Your face to shine, that we may be saved!

Psalm 80:1-7

COLLECT: Stir up Your power, O Lord, and come, that by Your protection we may be rescued from the threatening perils of our sins and saved by Your mighty deliverance: for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

The Lord's Supper has always been seen as a sign of unity between those who commune together at the Lord's table (1 Cor. 10:17). When Christians partake of the Lord's Supper in a church body that has a confession of faith, they thereby declare that they believe that they are one in faith with those who commune with them. Since people cannot honestly hold two differing confessions at the same time, they cannot honestly commune with those whose confession is in conflict with their own. If any do this nevertheless, they deny their own confession, and so deny Christ Himself (2 Cor. 6:14-18). **We ask visitors who are communicant members in a church not in fellowship with the AELC, or are not familiar with the *AELC Statement of Faith*, to refrain from communing today. First Advent Candle: Expectation and Hope

Scripture: Genesis 3:14-15

¹⁴ Then the LORD God told the snake: "Because you have done this, you are cursed, more than every domestic animal and every wild animal. You will crawl on your belly and you will eat dust all the days of your life. ¹⁵ I shall make you and the woman hostile to each other, and I shall make your descendants and her Descendant hostile to each other. He will crush your head, and you will crush His heel."

With the words that God speaks, He sets the course for the rest of biblical history. There is judgment for sin, but also the first hint that the effects of the fall will one day be undone. There is no way back to Eden. The only way for Adam and Eve and their descendants is forward to the cross. The long story culminates in Jesus Christ, the Seed of the woman, but it does not end there. Today, we are part of the unfolding story. We have received God's grace through the Seed of the woman, and now we are sent out to the ends of the earth to bear witness to the completion of God's plan of redemption and to offer His grace in Jesus Christ to all the descendants of Adam and Eve.

We light the candle of Expectation and Hope. May it remind each and every one of us of God's great promise to us. He is our hope, He is our Redeemer, and He is Saviour.

Prayer: Father, during the Advent season may we be reminded of Your promises to us and Your fulfillment of them. Help us to prepare our lives for His Advent within us. In the precious name of Jesus we pray. Amen.
