

Saving Faith rests on Jesus Christ Alone

In his Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7), Jesus used an illustration of a wise and a foolish builder (7:24-27). The foolish person built his house on sand. The wise person built his house on the rock. The Bible makes it clear that Jesus is the Rock, the foundation, on which saving faith is built. Paul wrote, “For no one can lay any other foundation than the one that has already been laid, which is Jesus Christ” (1 Cor. 3:11). Faith that rests on Jesus will endure. When Peter confessed of Jesus, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God,” Jesus replied, “on this rock I shall build My church, and the gates of Hades will not overpower it” (Matthew 16:16, 18). Jesus, not Peter, is the rock on which the church is built. This is why the devil with all his hosts will never prevail against the church.

Saving faith rests on Jesus Christ alone. He is the only way to salvation (John 14:6; Acts 4:12). Saving faith cannot rest on human works or effort. Good works will not get anyone to heaven. We simply cannot keep the law as God demands. God demands that we keep His will perfectly, in thought, word, and deed (Matthew 5:48; Galatians 3:10). One step less than perfection damns a person (James 2:10). If a person committed just one sin a day, in the course of one year that would amount to 365 sins. If we lived to be 70, that would amount to more than 25,550 sins. One sin is enough to condemn us. The Bible tells us clearly that we have all missed the mark of the perfection which God demands (Romans 3:23).

When an expert in the Law asked Jesus “what should I do to inherit eternal life?” Jesus replied, “What do the Scriptures say in the Law?” (Luke 10:25-26). The expert in the Law responded by quoting the summary of the two tables of the Law given in the Old Testament: “You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength and with all your mind” [Deut. 6:5] and, “You shall love your neighbour as yourself [Lev. 19:18]” (Lk 10:27). Jesus then said, “Continue to do this and you will live!” (Luke 10:28). The problem is, we simply cannot keep God’s Law as He demands. Good works do not save us (Romans 3:28). Christ alone saves.

There are other false foundations for faith as well. Some people base their faith on “I think” or “This is what seems reasonable to me” instead of on “This is what God has to say in the Bible.” Reason cannot serve as a foundation for faith. Since the fall into sin, human reason is corrupt. When it comes to matters pertaining to the question “How may I be saved?” reason will always come up with the wrong answer.

Human reason knows only one answer with regard to the question “How may I be saved?” It is “Do the best you can and hope that God accepts you.” However, as Solomon observed, “There is a way that seems right to a man, but in the end it leads to death” (Proverbs 14:12). Jesus is the only way to heaven. Faith rests solely on Jesus.

Human emotions are another false foundation for faith. “How I feel about God” is no foundation for faith. Emotions are fickle. Today they are high; tomorrow they may be low. Today we may feel close to God; tomorrow we may feel far from God. Emotions are fallible. Some of the people who felt the closest to God, like the Pharisees, were outside of His kingdom. Some who felt far from God, like the tax collector, were actually in His kingdom (Luke 18:9-14). It is not how I feel about God that gives me assurance of salvation. It is how God feels about me that gives me assurance of salvation. Those who rely on how they feel about God to give them assurance of salvation rely on shifting sand. We dare not have “faith in our faith.” Faith rests securely when it rests on Christ alone.
